Take Home Folder

 - BLUE After 9 warnings, I was asked to stop and think about my actions and how they were affecting myself and others. I filled out a reflection sheet explaining my actions. It will need to be signed a returned the following school day. The parent will receive a phone call or meeting at the end of the day. Reflection sheet and parent contact.
