Consequences of disrespectful and counterproductive behaviors may include:

3 nonverbal or verbal signals or warnings, change of seat, temporary change of environment, teacher/student conference, reflective writing, loss of classroom or school privileges, parental contact, detention, parent/teacher conference, community service, disciplinarian referral, or suspension.

Homework assignments are daily. Assignments are designed to review, enhance, or in some instances, prepare for future lessons. Yes, studying is considered homework. Assignments may be evaluated as a group or collected by the teacher for review and feedback. Homework is an essential part of the learning process and will impact academic growth and development, as well as grades. To earn full credit, students must submit work on the designated due date. There are monthly opportunities for extra credit. Students may receive three to ten days of advanced notice for special assignments, projects, or reports.

Attendance is essential for student success. All students are required to arrive on time, prepared to learn, explore, and grow! In the event of an absence, please send an excuse note within three days upon the student's return to school.
