School Advisory Council (SAC)

2019-2020 SAC meeting dates: 3/11, 4/1, 5/6, 6/3

The Lea SAC met on Wednesday, February 12th from 4:30–6:00 pm in the Lea Library. We discussed school behavior and student behavior outside of school, especially how teachers work with climate staff and administration to support students. We would like to meet with the Chief of School Safety officer but he was unavailable for our meeting. The SAC had a large discussion around facilities, especially asbestos which has been reported and is being monitored by the District. Our school has a publicly available asbestos report from 2018–2019 and teachers/families can submit any pictures and log concerns they have to the PFT phone app. We are continuing to work as a SAC with our administrators and PFT members to advocate for ongoing reviews of our building and maintenance. Finally, we discussed the upcoming budget season and options for supporting the growth of our school. Many decisions are yet to come but we wait for enrollment and budget projections in the next few weeks.
